



#### 3. What is your current PRIMARY relationship with Elmira College?





#### 4. Are you currently an undergraduate or graduate student?





# 5. If an undergraduate student, did you attend any other college prior to attending Elmira College?












15. On a scale of 1-5, do you feel that "Elmira is Your Place"? 1 being very much and 5 being not at all.


16. On a scale of 1-5, how satisfied are you with the College in general? 1 being very much and 5 being not at all.
